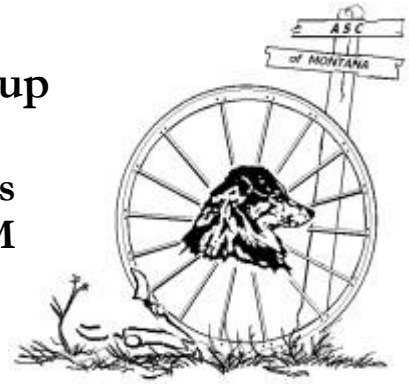

20 runs available divided between sheep and cattle Judge: Maxine Schvaneveldt

Stock to be used: 5 head per run Khaki Campbell or Indian runner ducks, 3-10 head per run Katahdin sheep, and 3-10 head per run beef cattle. Owners of dogs will be held responsible for all injuries to livestock during their runs. Replacement costs are: \$50.00 per duck, \$400 per sheep, and \$3000.00 per cow unless posted otherwise at time of trial.

Judges/handlers Meeting for arena trials will be at 7:30 AM sharp and trial will start at 8:00 AM

Judges/handlers Meeting for Farm Trials will be at 7:00 AM sharp and trial will start at 7:30

There will only be one walk through.

Awards

Daily awards: placement ribbons will be awarded 1st thru 4th place and Rosettes for High in Trial cattle, sheep & ducks and High Combined by Advanced, Open and Started in the arena trials.

Arena trial awards: Silver Buckles High Combined WTCH, HC Non-WTCH, HC Started Aussie (HC Started Aussie determined by 2 highest scores out of each class of stock.). A Started dog will be ineligible for the Most Promising Started award after 90 days of earning their second qualifying score in the Started Division.

Rosettes ribbons for High in Trial, High Combined (Aussie & other breed WTCH, Non-WTCH, Started be given out at the end of each day. Additional prizes may be awarded. Details for award determination are posted on the website: www.ascofmt.org

Farm and Ranch Trial Awards: Placement ribbons will be awarded to the first four places and a high in trial ribbon will be awarded for cattle and sheep. Other prizes may also be awarded.

IMPORTANT—PLEASE NOTE

- Draw will be posted prior to start of trial.
- Bitches in season will run in draw order.
- Bitches in season will remain crated when not competing.
- **All dogs must be on leash or crated when not competing.**
- Changes and/or substitutions, other than natural division progressions, must be submitted to the trial secretary in writing the evening before the trial.
- Move-ups are allowed, but they may not be recorded correctly unless written notification is provided to the trial secretary prior to the start of the trial.
- Any change requests, including substitutions, must be submitted to the trial secretary in writing the evening before the trial.
- Entry fees will be refunded only when a dog has been certified by a licensed veterinarian as unable to compete due to sickness or injury. Owner will be responsible for all vet fees.
- Pre-entry deadline: Postmark no earlier than July 18, 2023 and no later than August 8th, 2023
- No telephone, facsimile, email, or incomplete entries will be accepted. All entries must be on ASCA® entry forms with proper fees included.
- Please use one entry form per dog. Indicate AM Trial and/or PM Trial in the date row above the columns for each date.
- Note that the AM or PM designation on a trial does not indicate or restrict the order in which the trials will be held
- Trials will run back-to-back, cattle/cattle, sheep/sheep, ducks/ducks.
- Run limits and judging assignments are subject to change.
- **Selling runs will not be permitted unless the trial is full.**
- If the trial is full and you wish to sell a run, the transaction must be handled by the trial secretary. All offers to buy or sell runs must be submitted in writing at least one hour before the trial starts. No exceptions.
- **Please clean up after your dogs.** Clean up tools and receptacles are placed at strategic locations around the trial site.

Miscellaneous Items:

- Non-ASCA® dogs may enter the stock trial without a tracking number, however, only those with a tracking number will be awarded ASCA® titles upon completing title requirements.
- Bitches in season will run in order in the stock trials..
- Run order will be posted day of trial
- Individuals will be responsible for any damage done to the stock and /or equipment. ASCA®, ASC of Montana, and club members will not be responsible for any loss, damage or injury to persons, dogs or equipment of any competitor or spectator.
- All dogs must be crated or leashed except while competing.
- All ASCA® Rules will be strictly enforced.

ASCA® Tracking Number: Beginning 1/1/2003 for non-ASCA® registered dogs—In order to have ASCA® qualifying legs tracked and to receive ASCA® titling certificates, each non-ASCA® registered dog will be required to have an ASCA® tracking number. This requires a one time fee of \$20.00/dog. At the time if applying for the tracking number, the individual owner must also be an ASCA® member (minimum is Service Membership: cost \$20.00.)

General Information

All entries will be put in order of postmark date. Entries postmarked after August 8th or received after August 19th will be considered day of show entries. Day of show entries will be accepted until the trial fills. Once the trial fills, additional entries will be put on a waiting list in postmark order unless the applicant requests otherwise. Applicants preferring an immediate return of their application and fees if the trial is full should include instructions with their entry form.

Entry fees will not be returned if the show cannot be opened or be completed due to riots, civil disturbances, acts of God, public emergencies, or other events beyond the control of ASC of MT. Entry fees will not be refunded if the dog is absent, disqualified, excused or barred from competition by the Show Committee, ASCA, show veterinarian or the judge.

These shows are ASCA® sanctioned by the Australian Shepherd Club of Montana. All ASCA® rules apply. ASC of Montana and their members *assume no responsibility for any loss, damage, or injury sustained by an exhibitor, handler, dog, property, child or spectator*. No entry fee will be refunded if the show cannot open or be completed due to riots, civil disturbances, acts of God, public emergencies or other events beyond the control of ASC of MT. General Information for the Summer Roundup

Food: There will be food available on the grounds.

Directions to Trial Site:

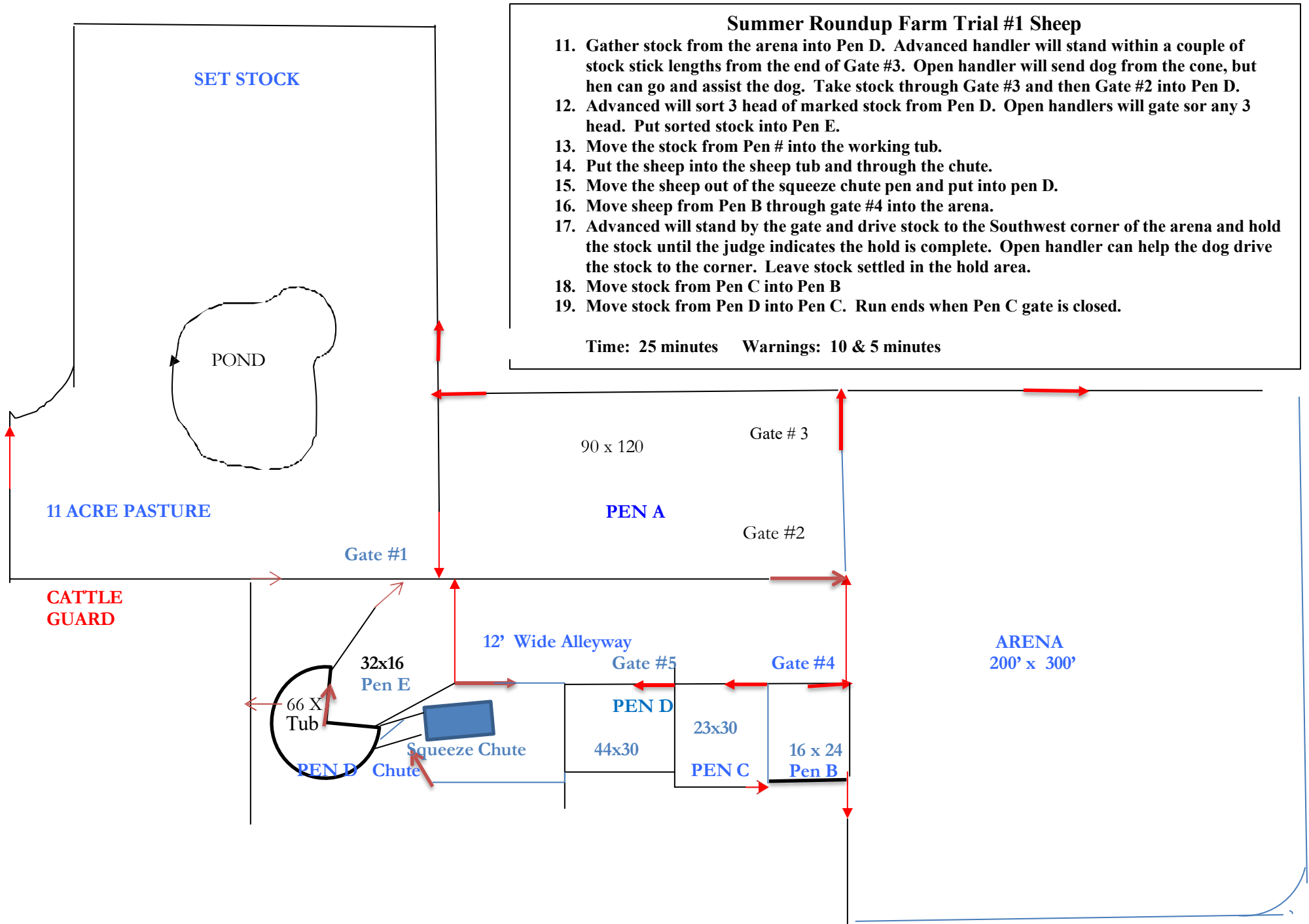
Coming into Lewistown from the West you will turn right at the 3rd stop light (1st Ave S & Hwy 238). Coming into Lewistown from the east you will turn left at the first stop light.

Drive past an Albertson's store on your right, continue on Hwy 238 or Upper Spring Creek Rd. Stay on main highway and go approximately 10 miles and it will make a sharp turn to the right. Stay left at the turn off to the reservoir. Continue on to the top of the hill and at next junction, stay to the right on Red Hill Rd. Go approximately 2 miles. Just past mile marker 13 you will turn left just past the Sweeting Ranch sign. Drive about a half mile down the lane (watch for the pivot irrigation system) to the ranch house and parking area.

11. Gather stock from the arena into Pen D. Advanced handler will stand within a couple of stock stick lengths from the end of Gate #3. Open handler will send dog from the cone, but hen can go and assist the dog. Take stock through Gate #3 and then Gate #2 into Pen D.
12. Advanced will sort 3 head of marked stock from Pen D. Open handlers will gate sor any 3 head. Put sorted stock into Pen E.
13. Move the stock from Pen # into the working tub.
14. Put the sheep into the sheep tub and through the chute.
15. Move the sheep out of the squeeze chute pen and put into pen D.
16. Move sheep from Pen B through gate #4 into the arena.
17. Advanced will stand by the gate and drive stock to the Southwest corner of the arena and hold the stock until the judge indicates the hold is complete. Open handler can help the dog drive the stock to the corner. Leave stock settled in the hold area.
18. Move stock from Pen C into Pen B
19. Move stock from Pen D into Pen C. Run ends when Pen C gate is closed.

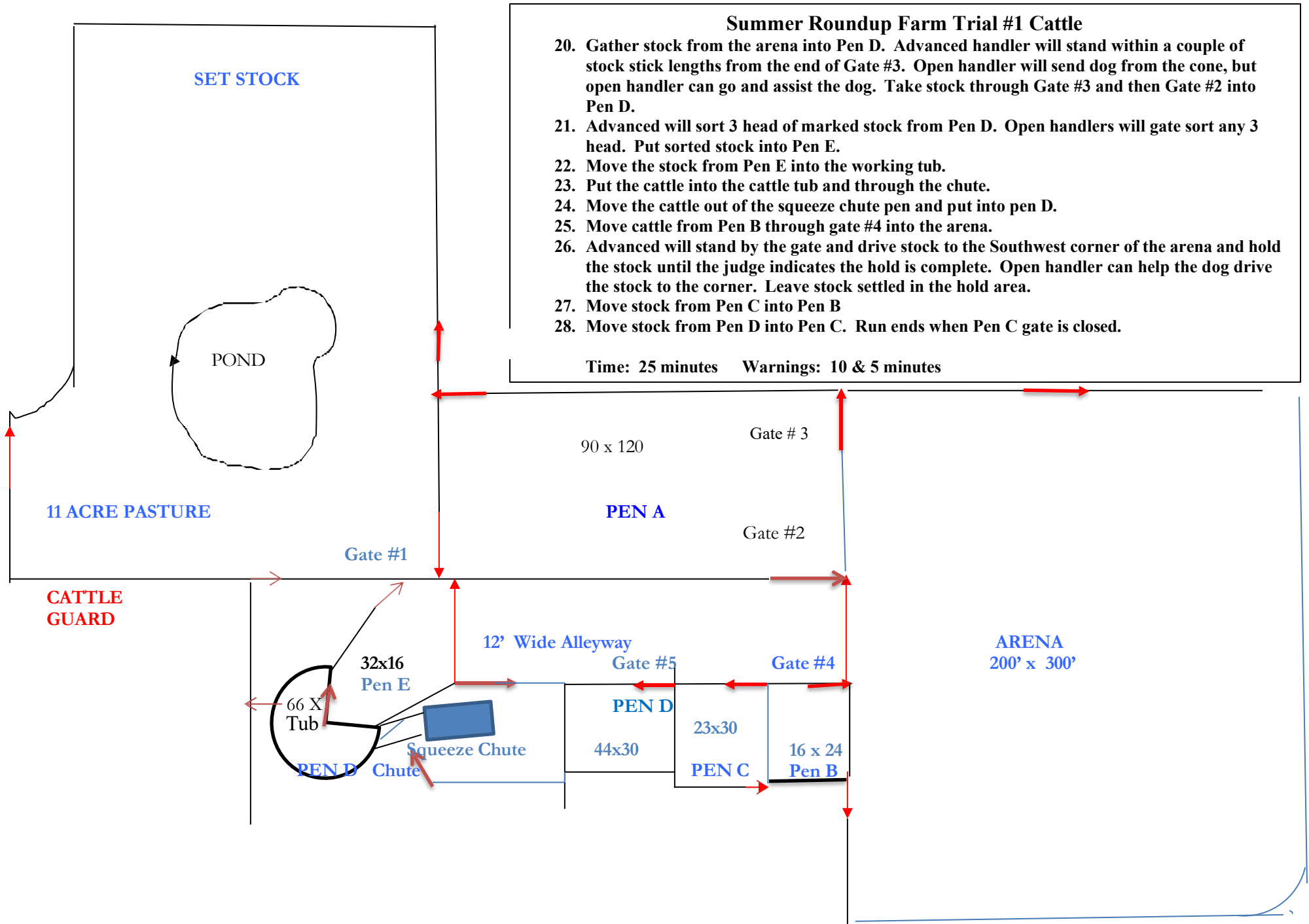

Summer Roundup Farm Trial #1 Cattle

20. Gather stock from the arena into Pen D. Advanced handler will stand within a couple of stock stick lengths from the end of Gate #3. Open handler will send dog from the cone, but open handler can go and assist the dog. Take stock through Gate #3 and then Gate #2 into Pen D.
21. Advanced will sort 3 head of marked stock from Pen D. Open handlers will gate sort any 3 head. Put sorted stock into Pen E.
22. Move the stock from Pen E into the working tub.
23. Put the cattle into the cattle tub and through the chute.
24. Move the cattle out of the squeeze chute pen and put into pen D.
25. Move cattle from Pen B through gate #4 into the arena.
26. Advanced will stand by the gate and drive stock to the Southwest corner of the arena and hold the stock until the judge indicates the hold is complete. Open handler can help the dog drive the stock to the corner. Leave stock settled in the hold area.
27. Move stock from Pen C into Pen B
28. Move stock from Pen D into Pen C. Run ends when Pen C gate is closed.

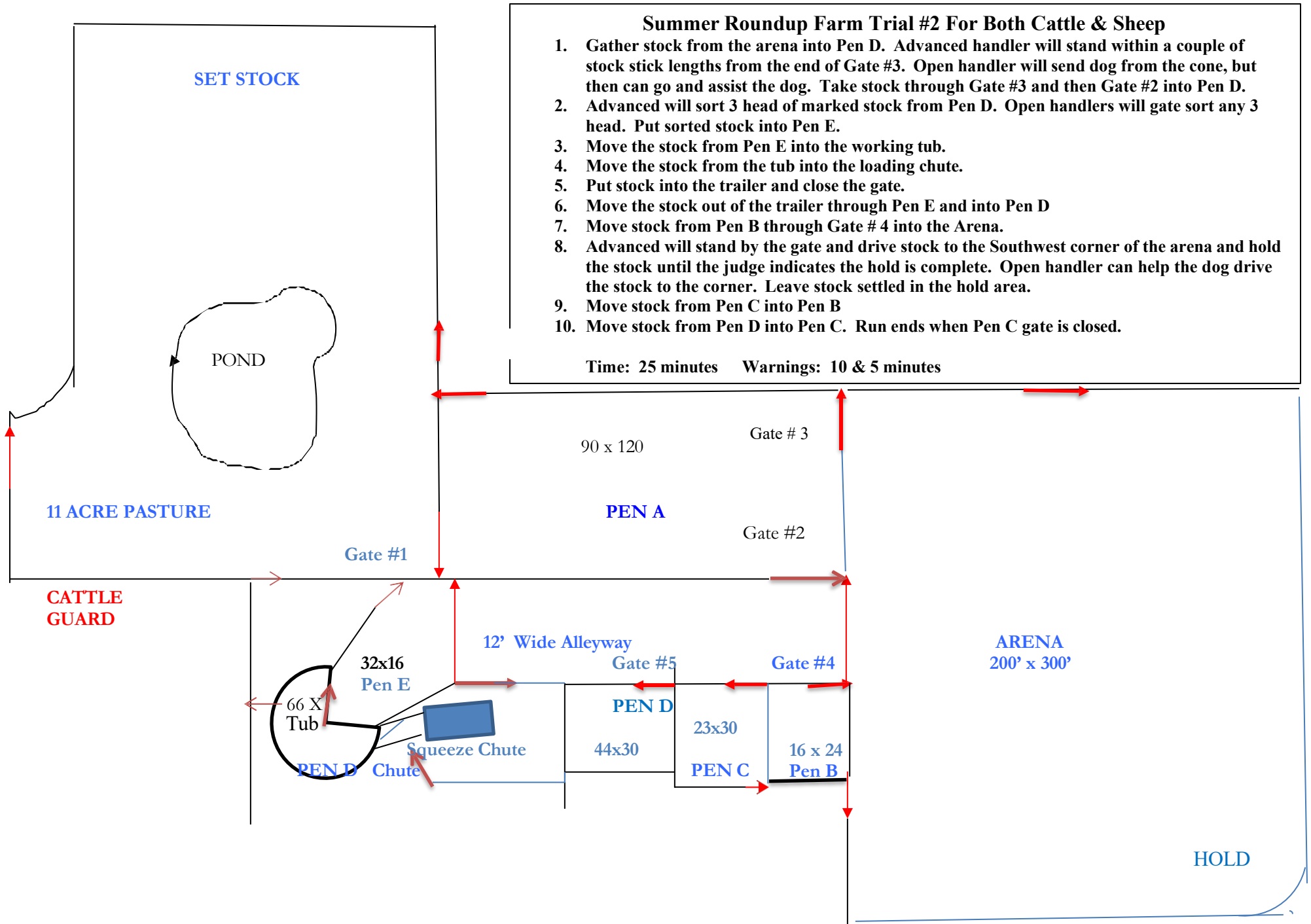

Summer Roundup Farm Trial #2 For Both Cattle & Sheep

1. Gather stock from the arena into Pen D. Advanced handler will stand within a couple of stock stick lengths from the end of Gate #3. Open handler will send dog from the cone, but then can go and assist the dog. Take stock through Gate #3 and then Gate #2 into Pen D.
2. Advanced will sort 3 head of marked stock from Pen D. Open handlers will gate sort any 3 head. Put sorted stock into Pen E.
3. Move the stock from Pen E into the working tub.
4. Move the stock from the tub into the loading chute.
5. Put stock into the trailer and close the gate.
6. Move the stock out of the trailer through Pen E and into Pen D
7. Move stock from Pen B through Gate # 4 into the Arena.
8. Advanced will stand by the gate and drive stock to the Southwest corner of the arena and hold the stock until the judge indicates the hold is complete. Open handler can help the dog drive the stock to the corner. Leave stock settled in the hold area.
9. Move stock from Pen C into Pen B
10. Move stock from Pen D into Pen C. Run ends when Pen C gate is closed.

Time: 25 minutes Warnings: 10 & 5 minutes



Summer Roundup Ranch Trial Cattle & Sheep

Gather stock from 8 acre pasture. Take stock through Gate #1 into Pen A. Move stock from Pen A into alleyway through Gate #2 and put into Pen D. Take livestock out of Pen E and take down alleyway through gate 2 and turn out into pasture through gate 1. Sort 5 head of marked livestock from Pen D and put into Pen E. Move livestock in pen E into the tub, and down the chute into the squeeze chute. Release livestock into holding area. Gather the stock and put back into pen D. Take livestock out of Pen C and put into Pen E. Move livestock from Pen D into Pen C. Run ends when gate closes.

Red arrows point to gate openings. All gates that will be used are 12 foot.

Run Time: 30 minutes with warnings at 10 and 5 minutes.
